READ Act Overview

- The Colorado Reading to Ensure Academic Development Act (READ Act) was passed by the Colorado legislature in 2012.
- Requirements include assessing all K-3 students using a state-approved assessment, guidelines for creating intervention plans (READ plans), and an annual data collection.

READ Assessment

- First 30 days: assess all K-3 using stateapproved literacy interim
 - 60 days after that- diagnostic for all SRD (significantly reading deficient)
 - Create READ plans for all new SRD (with parent involvement)
 - Update previous READ plans

Repeat in winter and spring

READ assessment and YOU

- All online assessment platforms and/or data management systems must be populated with a roster- which usually is exported from the SIS
- Are your SACs hand-entering students, or using the roster export function in your SIS?

READ Plans

- Schools must use the results of the diagnostic assessment to create a READ plan for all SRD students
- Schools monitor ongoing progress using approved interim assessment
- Plans are updated annually (at a minimum)
- Students do not exit until they reach grade-level reading proficiency
- How does your school keep track of READ plans?

READ Collection

- Each spring, schools are required to submit data for all K-3 students. This includes demographic data, assessment type, date, and score, READ and SRD status, retention info, and fund usage.
- This is how the state determines READ <u>funding</u> allocation, so it's very important that it is accurate and submitted on time.

READ Collection Timeline

- Training in March; *cohort* file available
- Each school's file is due to CSI on or before May 18
- Clearing errors takes several weeks; someone at your school must be available to resolve errors through early June.
- Summary file available in July.

- Why?

Similar...but totally different

Overview

- Senate Bill 08-212, Colorado's Achievement Plan for Kids (CAP4K) requires:
 - Assessing Kindergarten students in the following areas:
 - Physical well-being and motor development
 - Social and emotional development
 - Language and comprehension development
 - Cognition
 - Math
 - Literacy (these two categories fall under "General Knowledge")
 - Individual School Readiness Plans
 - Fall data reporting of population-level results

Timeline

- All K students assessed within the first 60 calendar days of school.
- Results of assessment used to inform Individual School Readiness Plan
- School Readiness data collection file due October 28, 2019

SR Data Collection

- TS Gold and COR include a report function that will generate an excel spreadsheet with the needed fields. DRDP-K does not; excel sheet will need to be manually filled in.
- Schools with waivers must manually fill in the excel template.

What's included (fields)

- School Code= xxxx
- District Code= 8001
- Total number of students= Total K enrollment
- Domain= 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 (pre-filled on template)
- Total number of students in Domain
 - This is filled with how many students met benchmark in x out of 6 domains. For example, the "3" row should be populated with the information related to how many students met benchmark for 3 our of 6 domains

What's included (fields)

- Total number of females in domain
 - Of the number entered in previous field, how many are female
- Total number of males in domain
 - Ditto above, but for males
 - P.S the two cells above should equal the total number of students in that domain
- Total number of students NOT eligible for FRL in domain
 - Total number of students from initial domain count that are NOT eligible for FRL
- Total number of students eligible for FRL in domain
 - Are you seeing a pattern? A note on this field. If a school is aggregating by hand, this portion will need to be completed by the person on staff with access to FRL info. This is confidential information, and should only be accessible by a few people at your school.


What's included (fields)

- Total number of students whose eligibility is unkown for FRL in domain
- Total number of Hispanic or Latino students in dom ain
- Total number of students who are not Hispanic or L atino in domain
- Total number of students whose ethnicity is unknown
