ESSA

General Annual Timeline – Initial Budgeting

May - June

Draft budgets are created and sent to schools w/estimated preliminary allocations.

Schools return draft budgets and agree to assurances.

July

New fiscal year begins.

Fund encumbrance retroactive to July 1st, 2020 for approved activities.

Further revisions may be requested.

October – November

CSI receives Federal Program approval.

Schools may begin drawing down funds for approved expenditures.

First RFF submissions take place.



ESSA

General Annual Timeline – School Year

November

CSI releases updated school level allocations to include prior year carryover and homeless count.

December

Post Award 1 revision, only required revision due from schools to designate additional funding.

January - April

Post Award 1 approval period.

Schools may submit additional revision requests throughout the year until April.

IDEA

General Annual Timeline

July

Draft budgets are created and sent to schools w/estimated preliminary allocations.

Schools are required to submit HR forms for all new SPED staff.

October

CSI receives Federal Program approval.

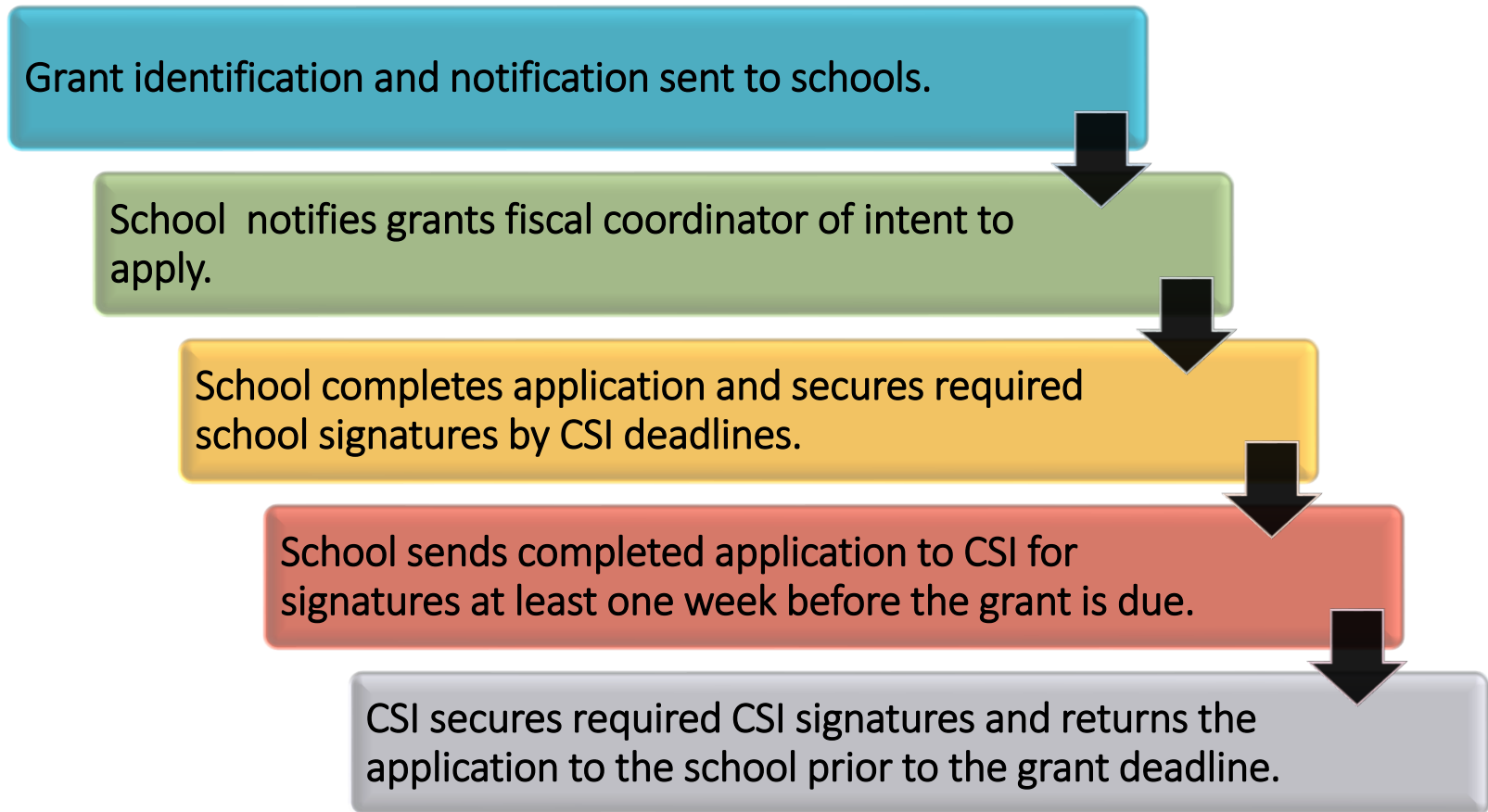
Schools may begin drawing down funds for approved expenditures.

October – May

Schools may add additional staff at any point by submitting a new HR form.

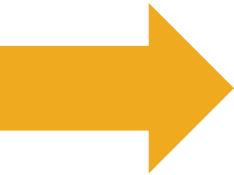

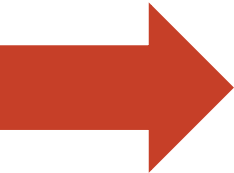

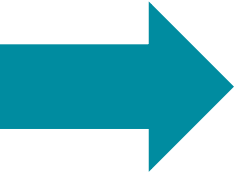

Grant RFPs released late fall – early spring



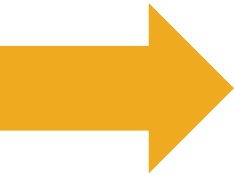
State competitive grant funding is prepaid

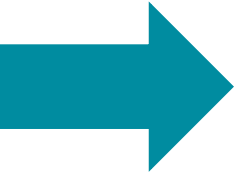
