CDIP/Industry Credential (Matriculation) Data Submission Guidelines

Last Revised April 25, 2021

Background

The Career Development Incentive Program (CDIP), or [Career Development Success Pilot Program in House Bill 18-1266](#), provides financial incentives for school districts and charter schools that encourage high school students, grades 9-12, to complete qualified industry credential programs, internships, residencies, construction pre-apprenticeship or construction apprenticeship programs or qualified Advanced Placement (AP) courses.

The calculation of [matriculation rates](#) for state accountability determinations relies on data provided by the Department of Higher Education and includes community college enrollment, four year higher education institution enrollment, CTE enrollment and/or certificates or degrees earned prior to graduation. The industry credential data included within this submission are intended for use as part of the **Fall 2022** matriculation rate accountability calculations.

A list of qualifying programs/courses is determined by the Colorado Workforce Development Council (CWDC) and is provided at the end of this document. This list is developed based on Colorado labor market data, existing secondary programs that correspond with high growth, high demand occupations and business/industry feedback.

In an effort to decrease overall data submission burden and to align industry credential submissions, the Colorado Department of Education, in consultation with the Educational Data Advisory Committee (EDAC), will continue with the combined submission of the optional industry credential submission that is used for matriculation rate determinations for accountability purposes and the [Career Development Incentive Program \(CDIP\)](#) submission.

The above paragraph in simplest terms is stating that CSI schools will report the data for the CDIP and the Industry Recognized Credentials together in one file.

Process

Intent to Participate Form

On an annual basis, a designated representative from the CSI office will complete the required Intent to Participate form on behalf of all CSI schools. The CSI schools should not fill out the intent themselves as the form is designed to be filled out by a district representative.

Industry Credentials Submission: Key Facts

This is a voluntary submission though CSI schools are strongly encouraged to participate.

Approved data will be included in reported accountability matriculation rates.

Submitted data will be used to determine possible financial incentives via the Career Development Incentive Program

The data submissions deadline to CSI will be **June 25, 2021**.

Template & File Transfer

The Excel template for the CDIP data submission is available on the [Career Development Incentive Program \(CDIP\)](#) web page of the CSI website. CSI schools should download the template from the CSI website and then populate and submit it according to the instructions contained on the first tab. Once all completed template files are received, then CSI will submit the data to CDE.

Data to Be Included within the Submission

For matriculation, any certificate earned during the 9th-12th grade school enrollment of a graduating student shall be included within the calculated matriculation rates. So, **it is recommended that all certificates, apprenticeships, internships, etc. be included within the submitted file.** For CDIP funding, monetary incentives will be participation and/or completion of the qualifying program **between October 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021.**

It is critical that column n, 'conferral year' is appropriately coded or monetary incentives will not be awarded.

Please note that for 'stackable' credentials, students must complete all required certifications, while only the terminal credential should be submitted. All stackable credentials are identified in table six of this document.

CDIP Qualified Programs/Courses

The standards that are set forth in each qualified program type defined by statute include:

1. **Qualified Industry-recognized Certification Program** - education program that results in an industry-recognized credential; with credits that apply to high school graduation (which may be earned through concurrent enrollment); and is designated as a qualified program by the Colorado Workforce Development Council (CWDC).
2. **Qualified Residency program** - provides students with a set of well-defined occupational skills and abilities by teaching both theoretical and practical concepts primarily through on-the-job training and related instruction; and ensures that students receive a form of compensation for the on-the-job training; and is designated as a qualified program by the CWDC. Successful completion is determined by the residency program.
3. **Qualified Internship Program** - is aligned with postsecondary education or employment opportunity; and employs a sufficient number of internship case managers to monitor student participation; and provides students with pre-internship training or coursework that is designed to prepare students for the internship; and implements adequate safety and supervisory safeguards for students participating in the internship; and is designated as a qualified program by the CWDC. Successful completion is determined by the internship program.
4. **Construction industry Pre-apprenticeship Program** — program or set of strategies that: is designed to prepare students for careers in construction industry by facilitating the entry of students into a registered construction industry apprenticeship program; has a documented relationship with at least one apprenticeship program registered with U.S. Department of Labor Office of Apprenticeship and; meets the quality pre-apprenticeship program standards maintained by the Employment and Training Administration of the U.S. Department of Labor; students must complete program requirements with a passing grade; and be accepted into a construction industry apprenticeship program as a registered apprentice is designated as a qualified program by the CWDC.
5. **Construction industry Apprenticeship Program** - must be registered with U.S. Department of Labor's Office of Apprenticeship, and trains students for careers in the construction industry; students must be accepted as a registered apprentice in a construction industry apprenticeship program; and employed by a construction industry contractor. Is designated as a qualified program by the CWDC.
6. **Qualified Advanced Placement course** – students must achieve a minimum score of 3 on the end-of-course examination in AP Computer Science A or AP Computer Science Principles which deliver a college-level curriculum, and award postsecondary course credit.

CDIP Grant Funding

The Department of Education shall distribute each year's appropriation in the following manner, assuming this program receives funding appropriation:

TIER 1:

\$1,000 for each student reported by the district or charter school as having successfully earned an industry-recognized certification by completing a qualified industry-recognized certification program between October 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021. Should the annual appropriated amount be insufficient to fully fund the total number of reported students, the Department shall reduce the amount distributed to each district or charter school to the amount required to fund the total number of students reported in this tier, based on the percentage of the total that the district or charter requests.

TIER 2:

If money remains in the program appropriation each funding year after fully funding Tier 1 students, the Department shall distribute to each district or charter school \$1,000 for each student reported as having successfully completed a qualified internship, residency or construction industry pre-apprenticeship or apprenticeship program between October 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021. Should the annual appropriated amount be insufficient to fully fund the total number of reported students, the Department shall reduce the amount distributed to each district or charter school to the amount required to fund the total number of students reported in this tier, based on the percentage of the total that the district or charter requests.

TIER 3:

If money remains in the program appropriation each funding year after fully funding Tier 2 students, the Department shall distribute to each district or charter school \$1,000 for each student reported as having received a minimum score of 3 on the end-of-course examination in AP Computer Science A or AP Computer Science Principles courses between October 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021. Should the annual appropriated amount be insufficient to fully fund the total number of reported students, the Department shall reduce the amount distributed to each district or charter school to the amount required to fund the total number of students reported in this tier, based on the percentage of the total that the district or charter requests.

FUNDING NOTE: Each school district and the Charter School Institute that authorizes a charter school and acts as a fiscal agent shall forward 100% of the amount of program funds received on behalf of the students enrolled in the participating charter school to the appropriate charter school(s).
